


# Sustainable Communities Strategies One Bay Area Grant Regional Housing Needs Allocation (2014-22)





#### Sustainable Communities Strategy

- Six scenarios
- Preferred Scenario: Jobs-Housing Connection Includes jobs, population and housing distribution projections for 2040
- Factors that determine projected growth:
  - Employment, transit access, household formation, housing production, and social equity goals
- Los Gatos Projection: 1,140 units or 9% growth between 2010 and 2040




### Priority Development Areas

- Locally-identified, infill development opportunity area
- 100 AC and local commitment to develop housing along with amenities and services
- Near planned fixed transit or bus service
- Planned and Potential PDA
- Los Gatos elected not to designate a PDA
- VTA designated two Potential PDAs
  - Downtown and Vasona Light Rail Station Area

#### One Bay Area Grant

- \$84 million to Santa Clara County
- 70% dedicated to PDAs and 30% to Non-PDAs
- Funding Period: 2013 to 2016
- Eligibility:
  - Adopt Complete Streets Policies through a resolution by 1/31/13
  - Updated General Plan Transportation Element by 10/31/14
  - Adopted and Certified 2007-14 Housing Element by 1/31/13



## Regional Housing Needs Allocation (2014 to 2022)

- Sustainability Component
- Fair Share Component
  - Minimum Housing Floor
- Income Allocation
- Sphere of Influence adjustments

Very Low: 189

Low: 107

Moderate: 131

Above Moderate: 190

Total: 617 units



#### <u>Alternatives</u>

- 1. Not endorse VTA's proposed Potential PDA in the Downtown or Vasona Light Rail Area
- 2. Endorses, but not adopt VTA's proposed Potential PDA in the Downtown or Vasona Light Rail Area
- 3. Redefine the Downtown PDA to the Highway 17 Corridor
- 4. Not endorse the Downtown Potential PDA, but endorse the Vasona Light Rail Potential PDA
