Background

Capital Program – historical funding sources:

- General fund year end fund balances
- Redevelopment Agency funding tax increments
- Grants select project types



Challenges

Funding sources are changing.

- State elimination of RDAs
- Reduced year-end fund balances
- Grants criteria changes



One-Time Funding Sources

- Newly Available Revenues
- Reserves
- Potential Future Revenues



Available Resources

- West Parr Property Sale
- RDA Dissolution
- Friends of the Library
- Existing Project Balances
- RDA Origination Loan

Total of \$5.3 million



Reserves

Funding is in-hand; requires Council approval:

- Budget Reserves "excess"
- Open Space Reserve GP Policy

Total of up to \$2.8 million



Potential Future Revenues

Requires Council direction to explore

- Surplus Property Proceeds
- Potential Tax/Fee Increases
- Estimated to be up to \$6M
- Timing issues with CIP



Revenue Sources

Estimated totals by Category:

- Available \$5.3 million
- Reserves \$2.8 million
- Future \$6.0 million+

Total - \$14.1 million+



Potential Capital Projects

Categorized into three tiers:

- Tier 1 Candidates for 13/14 or 14/15
- Tier 2 Candidates for 14/15 or 15/16
- Tier 3 Candidates for 15/16 or beyond
- Some projects tied to outside funding sources
- Some projects require additional study



Tier 1 Projects

All can be funded as 2013/14 projects:

- Creekside Sports Park Pedestrian Bridge requires Environmental Review and design
 - \$300k grant and timeline constraints
- Winchester/Lark Intersection Improvement
 Project partially funded with Developer Fees
 - \$400 k in-hand, potentially more coming

Total for Tier 1 projects - \$2.85 million

\$700k from other sources



Tier 2 Projects

Recommended as 2014/15 projects:

- Almond Grove Street Reconstruction
 - \$4.0 million first phase of \$12.0 million project
 - Community outreach and design work in advance
- Grant candidates, financing
 - Los Gatos Creek Trail Charter Oaks area
 - Highway 9/Creek Trail connection
 - Streetlight Retrofit possible financing

Total for Tier 2 projects - \$7.7 million

Up to \$2.0 million from other sources



Tier 3 Projects

Recommended as 2015/16 or beyond projects:

- One time increases to annual work
 - Street resurfacing
 - Curb, gutter, sidewalk
- Civic Center and Downtown Parking Improvements
- Parking Garage
 - Feasibility study required
 - Parking Lot 6 site

Total for Tier 3 projects – \$10.3 million

Unknown potential for alternate revenue sources



Beyond Tier 3 Projects

Other issues that Council may wish to consider:

- Almond Grove beyond phase 1
- Ongoing Pavement Maintenance
- Residential Streets requiring reconstruction
- Retaining Wall Replacement
- Improved Emergency egress to single access areas
