Alcoholic Beverage Policy & Live Entertainment Ordinance

Background

- 1994 & 2001 Town Alcoholic Beverage Policy (ABP)
 - Discourage entertainment establishments w/ alcohol service
 - Requires adoption of standards & permit process to allow entertainment w/ restaurants & bars
- 2010 Town Council initiates entertainment permit process preparation in conjunction w/ approval of CUP
- Current trends highlight need for revisions to ABP:
 - New uses (wine bars & wine tasting venues)
 - Modern dining (small plate food service & new cuisine)
- 2011 Town Council & Planning Commission Study Session
- 2012 Stakeholder meetings
- December 2012 Town Council Study Session
- September 2013 Business & Community Meeting

Proposed Revisions

- Refinements to Alcoholic Beverage Policy
- Proposed Town Code Amendments establishing the proposed Live Entertainment Permit Process:

Chapter 3, Article VII-Live Entertainment Permit Process

Chapter 29 (Zoning Regulations)-Land Use Regulations

Proposed Refinements to Alcoholic Beverage Policy

Proposed Refinements to ABP

- Expands meal definition to include small plates & certain types of appetizers
- Allows alcohol service for restaurant patrons waiting to be seated
- Defines retail wine establishments (wine bar) and tastings
- Establishes linkage to the entertainment permit process.

Proposed Live Entertainment Ordinance

Key Concepts

- Simplifies proposed entertainment permit review from 3 to 2 levels based on application
 - Planning Commission (w/ appeal rights)
 - Town Council
- Focuses on key operational components potentially impacting quality of life
 - Late Night Operations (past 10 pm)
 - Alcohol Beverage Service
- Entertainment Permit requires public hearing
 - Standard Neighborhood Notification (300 feet)

Key Concepts (continued)

- Leverages existing Town Code and regulations to address potential operational issues
 - Zoning Regulations
 - Noise Ordinance
 - Amusement/Entertainment Permits
- Defines Live Entertainment Use w/ proposed exemptions
- Late Night Hours or Alcohol Service requires
 Operational Agreement w/ Entertainment Permit
- Establish standards for the application, public review, permitting, and operation
- Requires Live Entertainment to be ancillary to a primary permitted use

What the Entertainment Ordinance Does

- Requires business operators proposing new live entertainment uses to obtain a Live Entertainment Permit
- Requires an Operational Agreement for applications which propose late night hours or alcohol service
- Integration with Operational Agreement sets standards for entertainment uses w/late night operations or alcohol service
- Establishes Town's ability to suspend or terminate an Entertainment Use w/ action on Entertainment Permit

What the Entertainment Ordinance Does Not Do

- Does not change an existing business's Conditional Use Permit (CUP) if no change or new live entertainment use is proposed
- Does not require an Operational Agreement or Live Entertainment Permit for an existing business w/ a CUP permitting live entertainment

(unless specifically required by its CUP)

 Does not eliminate Town's ability to review or revoke a CUP via established public hearing process, if violations occur






RESTAURANTS IN CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT (C-2 ZONE)






STAND ALONE BARS IN CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT (C-2 ZONE)
